

Certificate I in Agrifood Operations



Overview

The Certificate I in Agrifood Operations is designed for those students interested in a career in agriculture or related fields. It is a nationally recognised qualification related to livestock, cropping, horticulture and general agricultural practices.

This qualification is an entry-level qualification aimed at individuals entering the agriculture, horticulture and conservation and land management industries. It allows individuals to develop basic skills and knowledge to prepare for work. They may undertake a range of simple tasks under close supervision. The qualification is suited to learners with no previous connection to the agriculture, horticulture or relevant employment history.

As well as specific agricultural skills, this qualification gives students other employability skills such as: communication, teamwork, problem solving, initiative, planning, organising, self-management and technology.

There are no specific job outcomes to this qualification, but the skills achieved will assist in successfully undertaking a Certificate II pre-vocational program.



Further training pathways from this qualification include, but are not limited to, Certificate II in Agriculture, Certificate II in Horticulture, Certificate II in Production Horticulture and Certificate II in Rural Operations. Further qualifications beyond these allow students to specialise in areas such as dairy, pork and horse breeding.
